Social/Self Help Skills

BA K-3 – K-5 Curriculum

In K-3 the children explore each day. They learn how to share, how to take turns, how to walk down the hall in a line, how to identify colors and how to identify their ABC's. The children also enjoy singing, dancing, story time, art, projects and center time.

K-4

Reading

- Name the upper and lower case letters of the alphabet.
- Tell sounds that certain letters make and name letters that make certain sounds.
- Tell the beginning sound in words.
- Tell and/ or show the syllables/ different sounds in spoken words.
- Tell/show rhyming words in songs, nursery rhymes, and books.
- State that words are made up of letters.
- Demonstrate how to read text from left to right, top to bottom, and page to page.
- Show the front cover, back cover, and title page of a book.
- Tell the roll of the author and illustrator in a book.
- Act out or draw a picture telling the main idea of a book.
- Retell stories in different ways.
- Tell the character, setting, and major events in a story.
- Ask and answer questions about pictures in a story.
- Tell how certain stories are similar and different.
- Participate in many reading activities to show they understand the text.
- Write his/her first name, beginning with capital letter.
- Use and demonstrate frequently used prepositions when speaking. (to, from, in, out, over, under, beside,.....)
- Orally express his/her thoughts, feelings, and ideas.
- Participate in conversations with others by listening respectfully and giving ideas.
- Add details to his/her drawings.

Math

- Recite numbers to 20 in correct order.
- Recognize, name, experiment with writing numbers 0-10.
- Match quantities/numerals 0-10.
- Experiment with adding/subtracting using pre-k materials.
- Use comparative language (more than, less than) to compare objects using pre-K materials.
- Duplicate/extend patterns using concrete objects.
- Sort, categorize, or classify objects by size, color, length, height, weight, area, and temperature.
- Correctly name shapes.
- Recognize shapes in the environment.
- Explore 3 dimensional shapes.
- Measure objects using non-standard form of measurement such as cubes, paper clips, candy.
